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

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
- IQAC has played very significant role in nurturing the quality work culture at institutional level for students, faculty members.

Department of Geology has adopted practical methodology of teaching; students are given task to collect information in digital format on various aspects of Geomorphology and use it in correlative teaching.

Botany department being one of the ecologically important factor, it always organizes onsite sessions for plant species identification and classifications through filed tours to Jungles etc.

Faculties of Arts and Humanities like Sociology, Economics and Political Science studies social aspects through conduction of different kind of survey and its analysis using ICT techniques for report writing.

Department of Commerce is more practical oriented hence regular field trips, visits to financial institutions like Banks, Insurance companies are arranged.



Best Practices-I

Title of the practice: An activity a Year for welfare of Society (Widening and Deepening of Kayadhu River)

Goals:

- Try to minimize the water scarcity issue of this region
- To increase the capacity of water storage at river side near Sengaon basin.
- Increase the water recharge capacity so as to increase ground water level of Sengaon.
- Provide an opportunity for biodiversity to regenerate at the bank of kayadhu river.

Context:

Institute insist on carrying an activity every year for the welfare of society under this title we have carried an activity of social interest entitled Widening and Deepening of Kayadhu **River.** The purpose of water resources work decided to provide the sufficient drinking and agricultural water in the Sengaon town. In rural and hilly area like Sengaon drinking water supply is one of the important issues, at present groundwater recharge (widening and deepening) project are designed and executed by Toshniwal Arts, Commerce and Science, Sengaon during Summer season. Sengaon town is located along the bank of Kayadhu River in the Hingoli district of Maharashtra State having total geographical area of 21.51Sq.Km. Determinations of rainfall, run-off, and water loss, due to larger evaporation of water bodies and transpiration by vegetation, are essential in indicating the hydrologic characteristics of river basins. The main factors responsible to decline groundwater table in the catchments of Kayadhu River System at Sengaon is feasible cause's high exploitation of groundwater, extensive demographic, climate changes predictable and lack of water management. If we prolong next to our present trajectory, "what time the groundwater resources (Dug well and Bore well) runs dry, society know the significance of water". Kayadhu River is the main tributary of the Penganga, which is flowing in W-E trending (Sengaon to Hingoli). The upstream part of river catchment area extended in North West direction 222. 04sq.km. The recommendation of widening and deepening in the study area has been carried by technical surveyed and collection of well observatory data from Kayadhu river channel and adjacent part of Sengaon town. The Project is located at the latitude of $76^0 52'$ to $76^0 55'$ E latitude and 19⁰ 49' to 19⁰ 46' N latitude. The highest and lowest elevation of the Kayadhu river catchment area is 444m (bmsl) and 527m (bsml) respectively and average relief of the area 83m (bmsl). The drainage system of the catchment area is characterized as dendritic to parallel pattern. Catchment area of Kayadhu river from Sengaon town aerially extended 222.04 km² North West direction of the upstream. The geomorphically the catchment area classified in to various units plateau highly dissected, (PLH), Plateau moderately dissected (PLM), Valley (V) and Plateau Slightly dissected (PLS) and etc.

The Practice:

There are some technical conceptuality worked out like

Soil: Major portion of the Sengaon town with shallow clay soil and black soil, having thickness from 0.5m to 4m, as well alluvium soil. The southern side covered with alluvial soil deposited at river bank and black soil covered the gravel clay loam with sandy thin veneer form.

Geology: The surface geology is characterized by (Deccan trap) basalt and recent alluvial deposits of the Kayadhu River. Alluvial deposits are underlain by bedrock of the (Deccan trap) Basalt of Ajanta group formation. The alluvial deposits strata's occur as gravels, sand, silts and clays along river banks as well as bed. The depth of the alluvium (between 1 and 4ft) is generally controlled by the topography of the underlying basalt hard bedrock. It comprises beds and lenses of sands, gravels and boulders in a matrix of clays.

Land Use: The land use pattern recommended by the Revenue department of Govt. Maharashtra and interpretation with remote sensing data IRS P6 LISS III has been analyzed to understand the nature and extent of land use under various types in the Sengaon town.

- 1. Total geographical Area 21.51 sq.km
- 2. Cultivate area 16.35 sq.km
- 3. Buildup area -2.45 sq.km
- 4. Waste land area -2.51 sq.km

Climate and Rainfall Pattern: The Sengaon taluka has been experiences three seasons in a year. The rainy season (monsoon season) starts from June and lasts up to the end of September, while October and November are the post monsoon season. This is followed by the cold season from December to February and the hot season from March to the end of May. In summer the maximum temperature reaches as high as 42 degrees centigrade while in winter the minimum temperature is about 12 degrees centigrade. Sometimes due to cold waves over northern India, temperatures may drop to about 6 degrees centigrade. May and December are the hottest and coldest months of the year respectively. The average annual rainfall in the district is below 900 cm. Rainfall is not uniform in all parts of the district. The southern portion receives more rain. The district gets about 75 per cent of the annual rainfall during the southwest monsoon season. August is the rainiest month of the year. The variation in the rainfall from year to year is fairly large.

Recharge Structures: To harvest water where it falls, slow down the surface flow and increase recharge in aquifers in aquifer recharge zone. The catchment area to protect aquifers, *Toshniwal Arts, Commerce & Science College, Sengaon, Dist. Hingoli (MS)* Page 39

improve water availability for all and improve base flows in the river. It is the base flows that contribute significant part of surface or sub surface river flows in drought. In this study area of Sengaon town 03-strcures has to be implemented, which has been on deepening and widening of river bed for well groundwater recharge in around areas. The length of the deepening and widening should be decided based on surface run off calculations and technical measurement of size of the structures are 100 fit in length and wide size in 3 meters away from both banks.

Evidence of success:

Efforts taken in Kayadhu river widening and deepening project has resulted in increased storage capacity of water at river basin and increment in water level of the rivers falling nearby the catchment area of river flow, past experience of the locals states that even during the month of September and October peoples don't find flowing water however on completion of this project water flow and stiarge has become regular till January month. The other aspect of evidence is recognition with award entitled *Darpan* to the institute for such holistic social contribution.

Problem encountered and resources required:

This project being one of the holistic work hence very few hurdles have come across like Due to summer season high heat and temperature have restricted work time, drinking water issues etc.

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Best Practices-II

Title of the practice: College@School

Goals:

- To interact with school, college teachers and students for providing an additional advance development in some specific subjects.
- To interact with school, college teachers and students for pre-experiencing the academic status of the students.
- To provide school students benefit of college teachers knowledge and experiences.
- To provide knowledge and information to high school and 10+2 appearing students about career prospectus for fundamental subjects like Arts, Commerce and Science faculty.

Context:

Sengaon being located in remote, hilly and rural region, improperly connected with rest of the world hence it become very difficult for schools and college administration catering 10+2 education to survive and provide an extra advance knowledge. Toshniwal College is an only UG/PG institute in this region which is constantly providing education to young peoples of this region, so it become moral responsibility to take care of these budding younger's too, hence institute has taken an initiative to reach at school through faculty members in providing advance learning opportunity by making the faculty members to visit schools, colleges for delivering lectures, talks about the ongoing developments in subjects and other topics. This event has been utilized in understanding various aspects of students and their ability, family background for counseling in career finalizing, interactions with school, college teachers and many more. Benefit of learning fundamental subject needs to be explained in details so as to moralize the students for looking at these basic subjects for career making.

The Practice:

This practice is followed at large by Science faculty members and a few by Arts during the AY 2017-18 at nearby school, colleges of this region. It is executed under the guidance of Principal and an appointed faculty coordinator, a group of two faculty members are allotted a school, college for interacting with students and teachers as a manner of guest lecture, talk (by taking an advance permission from respective school/institution head). During this event the faculty member is suppose to interact with students and teachers too, so that good communication can be made with the teachers and students in feeling them comfortable for discussing on various academic issues and aspects. Faculty members discussed and informed the students about benefit of persuing career in fundamental subjects.

Evidence of success:

Increased interest of students in Science and Arts faculty has become an evidence of success for this activity; students belonging to specific schools, colleges where faculty members have delivered lectures has shown good interest in enrolling themselves for UG Science and Arts faculty. Admission of Two students eligible for INSPIRE fellowship during AY 2018-19 can be counted as an evidence of success.

Problem encountered and resources required:

This extension activity is to be conducted during the busy academic schedule of in-house teaching workload, hence it's planning and implementation required some extra efforts by some faculty members but still it is appreciable to see that all Science and Arts faculty members have made it a great success.
